New Age and Christianity

Christianity in its institutionalised form has no place in New Age thinking, because any kind of dogmatic claim of truth is rejected

For Christians it is not possible to believe in a New Age, since they believe, that in Jesus Christ the time has been fulfilled. Christians know they live in the end times and only expect the fulfillment of history in the coming of Christ.

On one hand New Age means a return to old gnostic ideas with their ways of self redemption, on the other hand

In its quintessence New Age thinking is diametrically opposed to Christian revelation.

New Age promotes an inner hollowing out of the Christian faith, since it encourages and welcomes an amalgamation of religions and cults. Not just a few Christians of our days have succumbed to this trend.

Christians do not search for a way of an inner ascension towards the divine, since they believe in God, who has come down to them in Jesus Christ.

Christians do not believe in ways of selfredemption by spiritual techniques, but they believe in the gift of salvation through the cross of Christ

Christians believe that there is an enduring difference between God, the Creator and His creatures. The highest goal of man is not to develop divine potential, but to live perfect love in its fullness. Christians known they are called to an eternal dialogue of love.

Christians cannot agree to the relativistic understanding of religion, since they are committed to the One who has said: "I am the way, the truth and the life: No one can come to the Father except through me." (Jn 14,6)



• After the patriarchally influenced era will now come a gentler age, influenced by a more feminine spirituality.


Man and nature will live in a new harmony, nature will again be recognised in its divinity. In a new ecology "the holiness of nature" will be allowed for.
